

Denniston Street

1663

Head of Goose Cove – “much older: than the 1834 causeway built for the tide mill. Intersection of Denniston, Bennett, & Holly Sts. Dam, sluiceway & mill pond on private property. The house is believed to have been built in 1663. (Garland – The Gloucester Guide)

1872

Goose Cove – Grist Mill at the Washington St. causeway. The mill at Denniston St. not identified (*Atlas of Essex County Massachusetts from Actual Surveys and Official Records*. Compiled and Published D.G. Beers & Co. 320 Chestnut St. Philadelphia. 1872.)

1899

p. 22 site of freshwater mill on Denniston St at head of Goose Cove. East side of Denniston owned by Geo. M. Wonson, site of sluiceway owned by A Bickford. Two unnamed streams meet at the site, but it is not identified as a mill (*Atlas of Cape Ann: Gloucester, Rockport and Manchester Essex Co., Mass.*, Published by Geo. W. Stadly & Co., 36 Columbus Avenue, Boston. 1899)

Goose Cove – btw. Washington & Denniston Sts., 0.4 mi, 1st order stream. There is an impoundment (Duck Pond?) of 1.4 acres above the Denniston St. spillway, dam at Duck Pond, earthen berm dam at Goose Cove Reservoir (57.5 acres) (City of Gloucester Hazard Mitigation Plan)
